- Rejoice about the good inclusion that does exist.

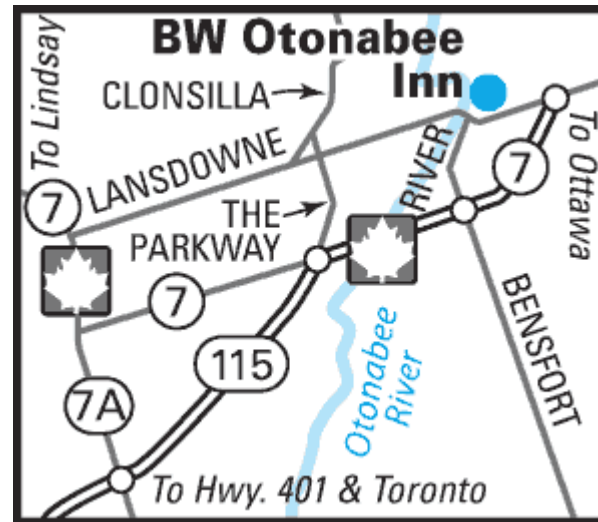
Who should attend?
